We emphasize that those who plan on applying to a four-year college should have taken the ACT test in March/April, or have registered for the June 10th test date. Juniors have been informed of ACT test dates via individual conferencing, announcements, Student Services Newsletter, and GHS Website. Registration can be completed online at www.actstudent.org. Juniors are also reminded to make campus visitations this summer and finalize their list of school choices for college admission.

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All requests to change your schedule must be completed by or during the first week of any semester. Request Forms are located in Student Services. Courses can only be dropped for the following reasons:

1. To correct a scheduling conflict or error in a student's program.
2. To repeat a failed class necessary for graduation.
3. Computer conflict or error.
4. Administrative class balancing.

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Each student is to carry at least 6 credits each year with a minimum of 6 classes per semester and must complete 8 semesters of full attendance, unless released under School Board Policy 5464/Early Graduation. Early Graduation requests must be submitted to your counselor no later than the end of the 3rd quarter of a student's JUNIOR year.

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Please allow for 2-3 business days to process all requests. Transcripts are printed on Tuesday and Thursday mornings only. All requests must be completed in writing. High school seniors receive 3 transcripts for free and then they are \$1.00 each. Post graduate transcripts are \$3.00 per request.

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All students are expected to be in their scheduled classes during exam week. The school does not have the authorization to excuse students from a school day or part of a school day even during study halls. If you have a study hall you have the following options:

1. Report to the cafeteria for the entire exam period and continue to prepare for exams.
2. Report to the media center for the entire exam period and continue to prepare for exams.
3. Normally, GHS requires that parents call the attendance office to report an absence and/or excuse their student from school. However, during the forthcoming exam schedule an exception is being made.
