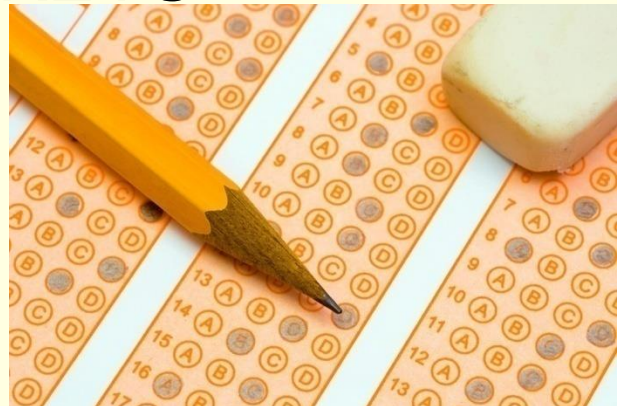

ACT/WORKKEYS

WI State DPI mandatory ACT test w/writing

- February 27th, 2018 at GHS
- Will count for College Applications

- WORKKEYS test-academic skills test with a career focus
- Mandatory test by DPI
- February 28th, 2018 at GHS

ACT

- Accepted by all Colleges and Universities
- Test four areas: English, Math, Science, and Reading
- Maximum score 36.0
- “Optional” writing assessment is strongly recommended
- Student (**not parent**) should register at www.actstudent.org
- Cost: \$46.00 / \$62.50 for plus writing
- May choose up to 4 schools for scores to be sent directly to them
- Usually recommended to take in April & /or June of Junior year
- May take multiple times (up to 12) – highest score accepted (Fee required for each ACT test registered for)

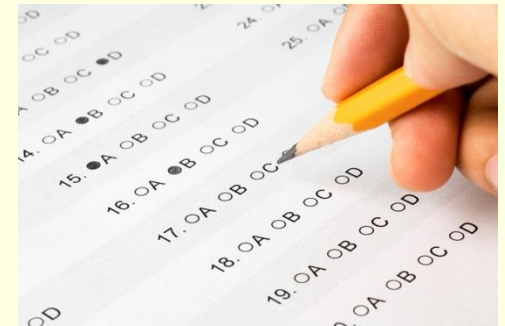
Tips to Better ACT Scores

- Read for FUN!
- Consider taking extra academic electives – especially literature courses
- Complete the ACT Prep Book – try to simulate testing environment
- Use results from prior test(s) to work on weaknesses

SAT

- May be required for admission to colleges in other regions
- Test Verbal, Math and Writing Skills
- Maximum score is composite of 800 on each of the three sub tests / Max 2400
- Student (**not parent**) should register online at www.collegeboard.com

COMPASS/ ACCUPLACER

- Recommended for most technical colleges in Wisconsin
- Evaluate student ability in the basic areas
- Some programs may have minimum criteria
- Test is administered after admission
- Test is used to determine course/level placement

AP Exams

- Schedule is on www.collegeboard.com
- Study tools posted as well
- Credit awarded is determined by each university or college
- Exams are scored 1 (Low) through 5 (High)
- Scores must be reported directly to the university from the College Board
- Colleges usually only accept scores of 3 or higher

ASVAB

Armed Service Vocational Aptitude Battery

- Tuesday, December 6th at GHS
- A comprehensive academic skills assessment
- Career focused interpretation
- Completely voluntary
- Does not commit student to the military or signal specific interest
- Can take up to 5 times

- Military
- Technical College
- University or College
- Work



UW System Minimum Admissions Requirements

17 Minimum College Preparatory/ Academic Credits

- English 4 credits
- Mathematics 3 credits (must include advanced level math)*
- Natural Science 3 credits(must include 3 lab sciences)
- Social Science 3 credits
- Additional Electives 4 additional units from: English, Math, Natural Science, Social Science, Foreign Language.

*UW Madison now requires 4 credits of math

- A minimum 2 years of Foreign Language (in one single language) are required for admission to UW-Madison, University of MN-Twin Cities, and strongly recommended at all other UW Campuses.
- *Many colleges may also require additional courses in:*
 - *Fine and Performing Arts*
 - *Computer Science*

College Comprehensive Review

Academic Factors

- Academic preparation remains of primary importance
- Rigorous college preparatory course work
- Rank in class and/or grade point average
- Test scores (ACT/SAT)

College Comprehensive Review

Other Factors May Include

- Experiences
- Work History
- Leadership Qualities
- Motivation
- Community Services
- Special Talents
- Socio-economically disadvantaged
- Etc

Exploring Options

- Campus tours (scheduled individually)
- Internet
- College visits
- College guides/rankings
- Finances



The Application Process

- A. Starts fall semester, senior year
- B. Cost for applications: \$30 to \$75 (some free)
- C. Read instructions & follow deadlines
- D. Presentation Matters
- E. Have ready:
 1. Personal resume of accomplishments, awards and activities
 2. Essay, personal statement and/or question responses-be sure to **PROOFREAD!**

E. Have ready (continued):

3. ACT/SAT

- *Know dates and scores

- *Know what the school requires (official score)

4. Letters of recommendation; if necessary (2-3)

- *Ask early

- *Ask someone who knows you well and can write specifically about your leadership and personal qualities (i.e. teacher, counselor, employer, administrator, etc)

TRANSCRIPT REVIEW

- GPA-Weighted/Unweighted
- Class Rank
- 23 credits required for graduation
- Rigor
